29TH MEETING OF THE ACSS SUB-COMMITTEE ON PLANNING AND COORDINATION (SCPC29) CONVENED IN KUALA LUMPUR

19 – 20 February 2025 — The 29th Meeting of the ACSS Sub-Committee on Planning and Coordination (SCPC29) was successfully held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The event organised by the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) brought together over 40 participants from all ASEAN Member States (AMS). The meeting was a vital platform to foster innovation, strengthen regional collaboration, and advance data-driven development across the region.

SCPC29 played a crucial role in reviewing ongoing initiatives and shaping the future direction of ASEAN's statistical development. Key discussions included the ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025, the expansion of the ASEAN Statistics Virtual Academy (ASVA) to enhance regional capacity, the ACSS Action Plan 2026–2030 and its corresponding KPIs and the ACSS Annual Priority 2025.

Along with the ASEAN Chairmanship and the upcoming World Statistics Day 2025, efforts are being undertaken across ASEAN to enhance statistical governance, build data capacity and promote innovation through digital transformation. A regional awareness campaign on the importance of statistics is being spearheaded in collaboration with AMS and ASEANstats. This initiative includes a Data Dissemination and Communication Programme, using infographics and digital media to make statistical information more accessible, engaging and impactful for the general public.

EMPOWERING ASEAN'S FUTURE: STRENGTHENING STATISTICAL CAPACITY FOR A COMPETITIVE REGION

"As we navigate an evolving global landscape, robust statistical capacity and collaboration are vital to ensuring ASEAN remains competitive and well-prepared to emerging challenges. Through the ASEAN-Help-ASEAN Framework, we are committed to advancing regional statistical capabilities, bridging capacity gaps and enhancing data governance to support ASEAN's economic, social, and political aspirations," said Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.



WHAT IS SCPC? THE GUIDE TO ASEAN'S STATISTICAL COORDINATOR

SCPC was established during the inaugural session of the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS) Committee on 2–3 November 2011 in Jakarta. SCPC plays a key role in helping the ACSS Committee make informed decisions. It serves as the main coordination point between national statistical offices across ASEAN. Essentially, SCPC helps plan, align and follow up on statistical activities to ensure the region speaks a common "statistical language."

SCPC is tasked with planning, reviewing, and following up on statistical activities that align with ASEAN's regional integration goals. It ensures that data shared within the ASEAN Community is harmonised, reliable and timely—making it a cornerstone for evidence-based decision-making across the region.

Additionally, SCPC serves as the main communication bridge between national statistical systems and the ACSS Committee. Its responsibilities also include facilitating the endorsement of policies, guidelines and strategic plans while promoting collaboration among ASEAN Member States.

What Does SCPC Do?

- **Coordinates** planning for regional statistical programs and initiatives.
- **Reviews** documents and proposals before they are presented to the ACSS Committee.
- **Follows** up on decisions made by the ACSS Committee and facilitates implementation at the national level.
- **Provides** feedback and advice to ASEANstats on new ideas, plans, and statistical frameworks.
- **Works** with ACSS Working Groups to finalise and elevate proposals to the ACSS Committee.
- **Supports** communication between the ACSS Committee and national statistical offices across ASEAN.

How Is It Organised?

- **Chair:** The country holding the current ACSS Committee Chairmanship leads the SCPC.
- **Vice-Chairs:** Represent the previous and upcoming Chairs of the ACSS Committee.
- **Secretariat:** ASEANstats provides administrative and technical support.

How Often Does It Meet?

- SCPC meets **twice a year**.
- The **first meeting will be hosted in person by the chair country**, while the **second meeting will be conducted virtually**, following the Sub-Committee's latest decision.
- Between formal meetings, SCPC stays connected through virtual discussions and email coordination.

Who Are the Members?

- **SCPC** is made up of senior officials from national statistical offices in each ASEAN Member State (AMS).
- **Each** representative is appointed by the Head of the National Statistics Office (NSO) of their country.
- **Members** are authorised to coordinate with various data-producing agencies and government ministries within their own country.
- **Play a key role** in ensuring their national statistical efforts align with regional goals and ACSS directives.

Who Does SCPC Report To?

- **SCPC reports directly to the ACSS Committee**, which is the top regional body responsible for statistical development in ASEAN.
- By fulfilling these responsibilities, SCPC ensures that statistical cooperation in ASEAN is efficient, inclusive and in line with the region's development goals.



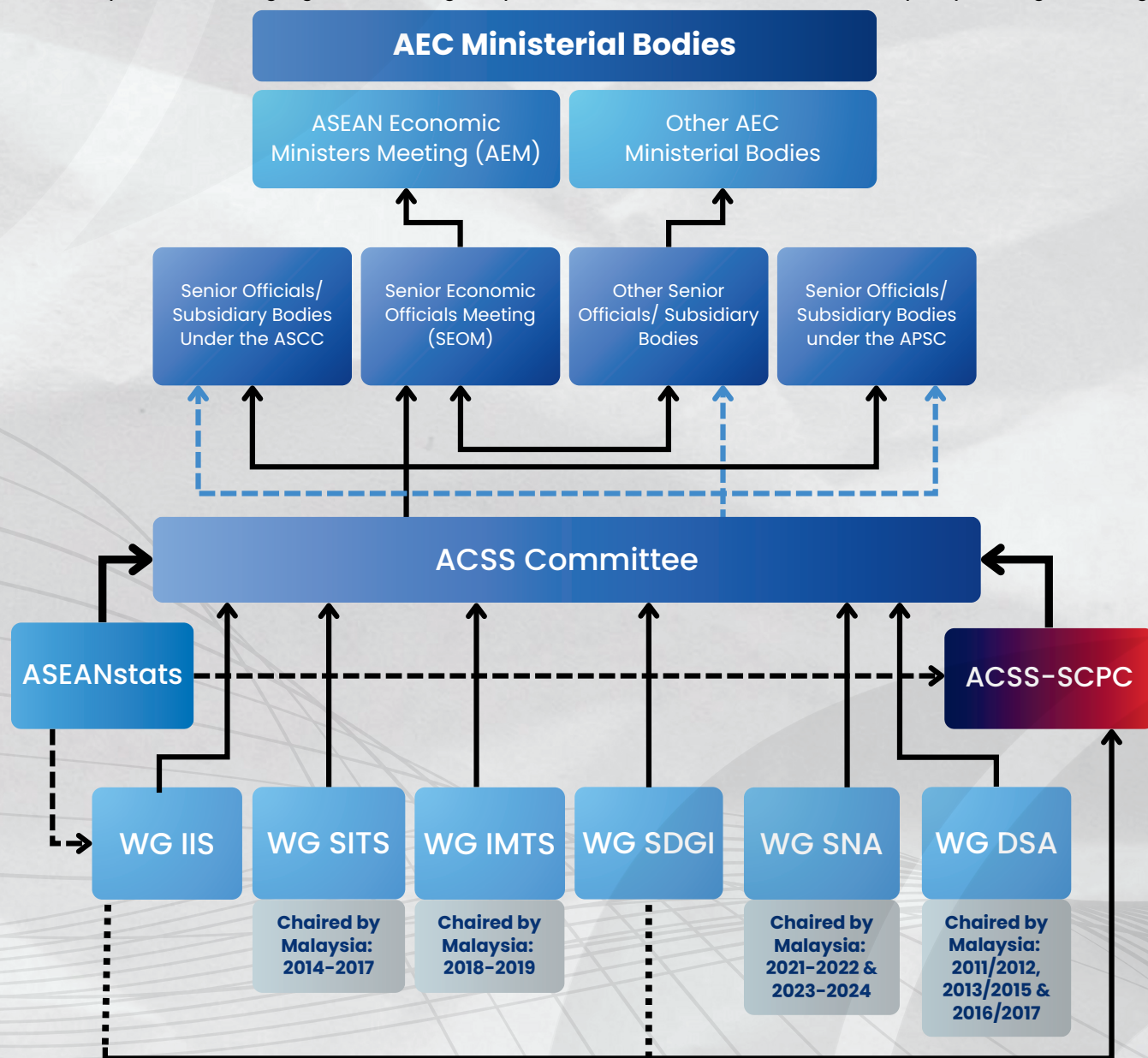

ACSS COMMITTEE RECOGNISED UNDER THE ASEAN CHARTER

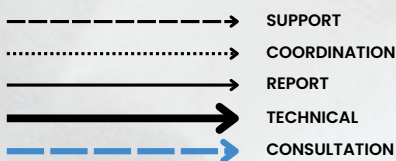
In strengthening the institutional role of statistics within ASEAN, the ASEAN Economic Ministers (AEM) have endorsed the Terms of Reference (ToR) of the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS) Committee and approved its inclusion in Annex 1 of the ASEAN Charter. This formal recognition establishes the ACSS Committee as a sectoral body reporting directly to the AEM through the Senior Economic Officials Meeting (SEOM).

This development reinforces the ACSS Committee's mandate to coordinate the production and dissemination of timely, relevant, and comparable statistics that support the ASEAN Community's three pillars: Political security, economic development, and Socio-Cultural development. It also highlights the strategic importance of statistics in evidence-based policy and regional integration.

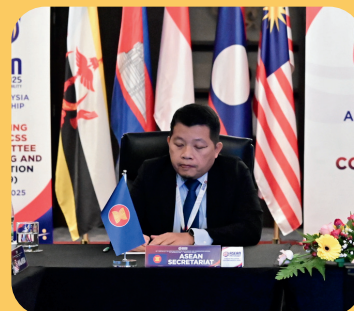

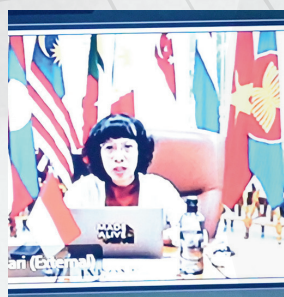


SCPC29 marked a significant step in strengthening the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS). The meeting reviewed and advanced several key initiatives aligned with ASEAN's vision for a data-driven, cohesive and future-ready statistical community. Among the key decisions were:

- **ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025:** Endorsed the timeline and quality framework, with a recommendation for its presentation at ministerial-level ASEAN platforms.
- **ASEAN Statistics Virtual Academy (ASVA):** Supported proof-of-concept development, user requirements, and a collaborative framework to guide implementation.
- **Regional Awareness Initiative:** Agreed to launch a campaign highlighting the value of official statistics, with outcomes to be presented at ACSS15.
- **Data Governance:** Initiated a Concept Note on Data Governance for ASEAN Member States (AMS), spearheaded by Malaysia and coordinated by ASEANstats.
- **ACSS Code of Practice:** Scheduled a self-assessment of Section A for mid-2025, with results to be presented at SCPC30 and ACSS15.
- **ACSS Action Plan 2026–2030:** Refined and trialled the draft plan, incorporating new KPIs that reflect digitalisation and inter-agency collaboration.
- **ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) Strategic Plan 2026–2030:** Reviewed and aligned Key Outcome Indicators (KOIs) with statistical priorities.
- **ACSS Annual Work Plan 2024:** Noted progress and strong engagement across ASEANstats platforms in implementing the Work Plan and monitoring KPIs.
- **API and ASEAN Statistical Indicators (ASI):** Received updates, including pilot implementation cases with Singapore and Indonesia.
- **ASEAN Digital Index (ADIX):** Discussed its role as a regional tool for digital monitoring and benchmarking.
- **Regional Cooperation and Capacity-Building:** Reinforced commitment under the ASEAN-Help-ASEAN Framework (AHAF), launched a Focus Group on Big Data, and acknowledged ongoing international support.

These outcomes demonstrate the Sub-Committee's strong commitment to enhancing statistical governance, regional capacity and data accessibility in ASEAN.







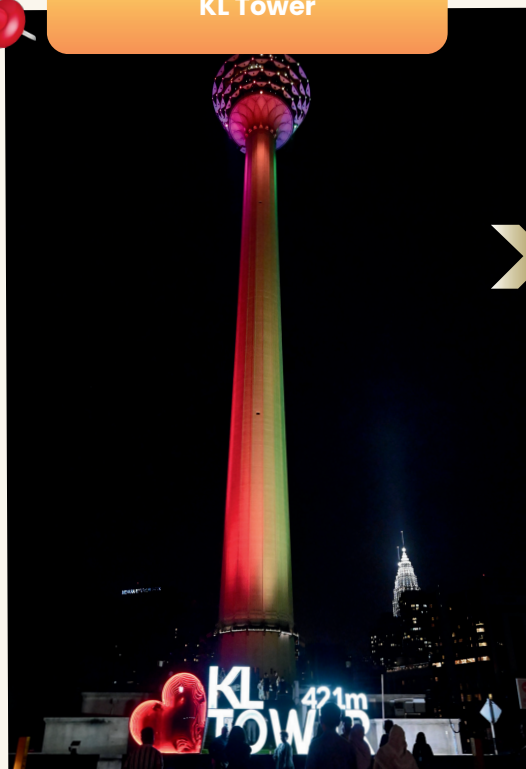

ASEAN Malaysia Chairmanship 2025

Malaysia Strengthens ASEAN Statistical Cooperation as Chair of ACSIS15
Malaysia Hosts the 29th Meeting of the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS)
Sub-Committee on Planning and Coordination (SCPC29)

KUALA LUMPUR, 21 February 2025 – The 29th Meeting of the ACSS Sub-Committee on Planning and Coordination (SCPC29) successfully convened from 19 to 20 February 2025 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The meeting hosted by the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) and gathered representatives from ASEAN Member States (AMS) and the ASEAN Secretariat to discuss key statistical priorities and collaborative efforts to enhance data-driven decision-making across the region.

In his opening remarks, Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, emphasised Malaysia's commitment as the Chair of the 15th Session of the ASEAN Community Statistical System in 2025 (ACSS15) to strengthening regional cooperation, fostering statistical excellence and ensuring high-quality, timely, and reliable data for ASEAN's sustainable development.

"As we navigate an evolving global landscape, robust statistical capacity and collaboration are vital to ensuring ASEAN remains competitive and responsive to emerging challenges. Through the ASEAN-Help-ASEAN Framework, we are committed to advancing regional statistical capabilities, bridging capacity gaps and enhancing data governance to support ASEAN's economic, social, and political aspirations," said Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

The meeting was attended by 40 participants from AMS and Malaysian representatives from the SCPC Members as well as the ACSS Working Groups in person, along with one AMS that participated online.

SCPC29 provided a strategic platform to review progress and set action plans for ASEAN's statistical community. Discussions focused on strengthening the monitoring mechanisms for the ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025, advancing the implementation of the ASEAN Statistics Virtual Academy to enhance statistical capacity

through the Concept Note on Data Governance for AMS. Additionally, members worked on defining the strategic direction for ASEAN's statistical development through the ACSS Action Plan 2025-2030, with a strong emphasis on digital transformation, innovation, and regional integration. The ASEAN-Help-ASEAN Framework (AHAF) was also highlighted as a key initiative to enhance capacity-building efforts and leverage regional expertise.

As part of its chairmanship, Malaysia is driving initiatives to enhance statistical awareness and promote data governance across AMS. In conjunction with World Statistics Day 2025, in collaboration with AMS and ASEANStats, planning to have an Awareness Program on the Importance of Statistics and a Data Dissemination and Communication Program using infographics to increase public engagement.

SCPC29 reaffirmed AMS's commitment to aligning statistical initiatives with ASEAN's post-2025 vision. Malaysia will continue promoting data accessibility, interoperability, and statistical literacy, hosting key ASEAN statistical events, including ACSIS15 and the ASEAN Statistical Forum. "Together, we must harness the power of data to inform policy, drive innovation, and create a resilient, inclusive, and sustainable ASEAN," added Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

In conjunction with SCPC29, DOSM hosted a Kuala Lumpur night tour, offering delegates a glimpse of Malaysia's rich cultural heritage and economic potential. This initiative reinforced Malaysia's status as a premier tourism and investment destination under the 'Malaysia Truly Asia' campaign. Malaysia's leadership in ACSS underscores its commitment to statistical excellence, capacity-building, and sustainable development, further strengthening collaboration within the ASEAN statistical community.

The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) has launched OpenDOSM NextGen as a medium that provides data catalogue and visualisations to facilitate users' analysis and can be accessed through <https://open.dosm.gov.my>.

The Government of Malaysia has declared National Statistics Day (MyStats Day) on October 20th. MyStats Day theme is "Statistics is the Essence of Life".

Kepengerusan ASEAN Malaysia 2025

Malaysia Mengukuhkan Kerjasama Statistik ASEAN sebagai Pengerusi ACSIS15
Malaysia menjadi tuan rumah Mesyuarat Ke-29 Jawatankuasa Kecil Perancangan dan Penyelarasan (SCPC29) Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN (ACSS)

KUALA LUMPUR, 21 Februari 2025 – Mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Kecil Perancangan dan Penyelarasan ACSS Ke-29 (SCPC29) telah berjaya diadakan dari 19 hingga 20 Februari 2025 di Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Mesyuarat ini dianjurkan oleh Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) yang menghimpunkan wakil daripada Negara Anggota ASEAN (AMS) dan Sekretariat ASEAN bagi membincangkan keutamaan statistik utama serta usaha kolaboratif dalam memperkuhi pembuatan keputusan berasaskan data di seluruh rantau ini.

Dalam ucapan perasmian, Ketua Perangkapan Malaysia, Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, menegaskan komitmen Malaysia sebagai Pengerusi Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) pada tahun 2025 dalam memperkuhi kerjasama serantau, memacu kecekapan statistik serta memastikan penyediaan data yang berkualiti, tepat pada masanya dan boleh dipercayai bagi menyokong pembangunan mampan ASEAN.

"Dalam landskap global yang sentiasa berkembang, keupayaan statistik yang kukuh serta kerjasama serantau adalah penting bagi memastikan ASEAN kekal berdaya saing dan responsif terhadap cabaran semasa. Melalui Rangka Kerja ASEAN-Help-ASEAN, kami komited untuk meningkatkan keupayaan statistik serantau, merapatkan jurang kapasiti, dan memperkuhi tabir urus data bagi menyokong aspirasi ekonomi, sosial dan politik ASEAN" kata Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

Mesyuarat ini dihadiri oleh 40 peserta dari AMS serta wakil Malaysia daripada AHL SCPC dan Kumpulan Kerja ACSS secara fizikal, bersama satu negara AMS yang menyertai secara dalam talian.

SCPC29 berfungsi sebagai platform strategik untuk menilai kemajuan serta merangka pelan tindakan bagi komuniti statistik ASEAN. Perbincangan dalam mesyuarat ini memberi lumbung kepada usaha memperkuhi mekanisme pemantauan bagi Laporan Kemajuan Petunjuk SDG ASEAN 2025, mengukuhkan pelaksanaan Akademi Statistik Maya ASEAN dalam meningkatkan kapasiti statistik di seluruh AMS, serta

membangunkan rangka kerja tabir urus data yang sistematis dan berpadanan standard merentasi Nota Konsep mengenai Tabir Urus Data bagi AMS. Selain itu, ahli mesyuarat turut membincangkan hala tuju strategik bagi pembangunan statistik ASEAN melalui Pelan Tindakan ACSS 2025-2030, dengan memberi penekanan kepada transformasi digital, inovasi, dan integrasi serantau. Rangka Kerja ASEAN-Help-ASEAN (AHAF) turut diketengahkan sebagai inisiatif utama dalam memperkuhi usaha pembangunan kapasiti serta memfasilkan kepakaran serantau.

Sebagai bahagian daripada kepengkerusannya, Malaysia berpersaan memacu inisiatif bagi meningkatkan kesedaran statistik dan memperkuhi tabir urus data dalam kalangan AMS. Bersempena dengan Hari Statistik Sedunia 2025, Malaysia, bersama AMS dan ASEANStats, merancang untuk mengorganikan Program Kesedaran mengenai Kepentingan Statistik serta Program Penyelarasan dan Komunikasi Data menggunakan infografi sebagai medium bagi meningkatkan penglibatan masyarakat secara lebih efektif.

SCPC29 turut mengesahkan komitmen AMS dalam menyelaraskan inisiatif statistik seiring dengan Visi ASEAN Pasca-2025. Malaysia akan terus memperkasa kebolehpapian data, interoperabiliti serta literasi statistik di seluruh rantau, selain mengorganikan acara statistik utama ASEAN, termasuk ACSIS15 dan Forum Statistik ASEAN. "Bersama-sama, kita perlu memanfaatkan kuasa data dalam mengubah dasar, memacu inovasi, serta membentuk ASEAN yang berdaya tahan, inklusif, dan mampan," tambah Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

Sebagai pelengkap kepada SCPC29, DOSM telah mengorganikan lawatan di sekitar Kuala Lumpur, memberikan delegasi peluang untuk mengenalikan warisan budaya serta potensi ekonomi Malaysia. Inisiatif ini mengukuhkan status Malaysia sebagai destinasi utama pelancongan dan pelaburan di bawah kempen 'Malaysia Truly Asia'. Kepengerusan Malaysia dalam ACSS menegaskan komitmen negara terhadap kecekapan statistik, pembangunan kapasiti dan pembangunan mampan sekali gus memperkuhi kerjasama dalam komuniti statistik ASEAN.

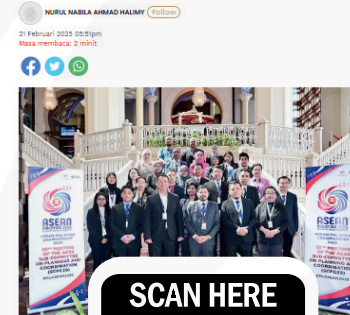
