KENYATAAN MEDIA BAGI STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI MEI 2025

JUMLAH PERDAGANGAN BAGI TUJUH NEGERI MEREKODKAN PERKEMBANGAN POSITIF BERNILAI RM159.4 BILION PADA BULAN MEI 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 26 JUN 2025 – Malaysia mencatatkan jumlah perdagangan bernilai RM252.5 bilion pada Mei 2025 dengan eksport dan import masing-masing bernilai RM126.6 bilion dan RM125.9 bilion, seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI MEI 2025**.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata prestasi eksport bernilai RM126.6 bilion pada Mei 2025, menurun sebanyak RM1.4 bilion (-1.1%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Penurunan eksport dipengaruhi oleh eksport yang lebih rendah di kebanyakan negeri iaitu Johor (-RM5.3 bilion), Kedah (-RM1.7 bilion), Sarawak (-RM1.6 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (-RM1.0 bilion), Terengganu (-RM902.5 juta), Negeri Sembilan (-RM322.4 juta), Pahang (-RM285.2 juta), Sabah (-RM160.9 juta) dan Perak (-RM153.6 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, nilai eksport meningkat di Pulau Pinang sebanyak RM8.8 bilion, Selangor (+RM530.2 juta), Melaka (+RM393.4 juta), W.P. Labuan (+RM101.1 juta), Kelantan (+RM10.3 juta) dan Perlis (+RM1.5 juta).

Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama dengan sumbangan 36.2 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (19.4%), Selangor (18.8%), Sarawak (5.9%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (3.6%).

Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin memaklumkan import pada bulan Mei 2025 meningkat RM7.8 bilion (+6.6%) berbanding bulan yang sama pada tahun 2024. Peningkatan import disebabkan oleh import yang lebih tinggi di Selangor (+RM6.8 bilion), Pulau Pinang (+RM5.4 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.4 bilion), Perak (RM191.4 juta), Perlis (+RM40.7 juta) dan Kelantan (+RM17.7 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, nilai import menurun di Johor sebanyak RM2.3 bilion, Negeri Sembilan (-RM1.6 bilion), Melaka (-RM1.3 bilion), Kedah (-RM870.8 juta), Pahang (-RM712.9 juta), Terengganu (-RM251.8 juta), Sarawak (-RM211.0 juta), Sabah (-RM96.4 juta) dan W.P. Labuan (-RM48.6 juta).

Selangor mendominasi import Malaysia dengan sumbangan 29.2 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (23.0%), Johor (20.5%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (9.2%) dan Kedah (4.4%).


Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025: Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) akan mempengerusikan Jawatankuasa Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) yang bertujuan untuk memperkukuh kerjasama statistik ke arah pembangunan serantau yang mampan.

Malaysia buat julung kalinya telah menduduki tangga pertama (1) di peringkat global dalam laporan dwi-tahunan Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 yang dikeluarkan oleh *Open Data Watch (ODW)*, mengatasi 198 negara lain. Pencapaian ini merupakan lonjakan ketara daripada kedudukan ke-67 dalam penilaian ODIN 2022/23.

Kerajaan Malaysia telah mengisytiharkan 20 Oktober sebagai Hari Statistik Negara (MyStats Day), dengan tema 'Statistik Nadi Kehidupan.' Sementara itu, Hari Statistik Dunia Keempat akan disambut pada 20 Oktober 2025 dengan tema '*Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone*'.

PRESS STATEMENT

FOR EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE MAY 2025

TOTAL TRADE FOR SEVEN STATES RECORDED A POSITIVE GROWTH WITH A VALUE OF RM159.4 BILLION IN MAY 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 26 JUNE 2025 – Malaysia's total trade for May 2025 amounted to RM252.5 billion with exports and imports recorded RM126.6 billion and RM125.9 billion, respectively as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE MAY 2025**.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said exports was valued at RM126.6 billion in May 2025, decreased RM1.4 billion (-1.1%) as compared to the same month of the previous year. The decrease in exports was attributed to the lower exports in most states such as Johor (-RM5.3 billion), Kedah (-RM1.7 billion), Sarawak (-RM1.6 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (-RM1.0 billion), Terengganu (-RM902.5 million), Negeri Sembilan (-RM322.4 million), Pahang (-RM285.2 million), Sabah (-RM160.9 million) and Perak (-RM153.6 million). However, exports increased in Pulau Pinang by RM8.8 billion, Selangor (+RM530.2 million), Melaka (+RM393.4 million), W.P. Labuan (+RM101.1 million), Kelantan (+RM10.3 million) and Perlis (+RM1.5 million).

Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with 36.2 per cent, followed by Johor (19.4%), Selangor (18.8%), Sarawak (5.9%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (3.6%).

Looking at the performance of imports by state, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said imports in May 2025 increased RM7.8 billion (+6.6%) as compared to the same month in year 2024. The increase in imports was attributed by the higher imports in Selangor (+RM6.8 billion), Pulau Pinang (+RM5.4 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.4 billion), Perak (RM191.4 million), Perlis (+RM40.7 million) and Kelantan (+RM17.7 million). However, imports decreased in Johor by RM2.3 billion, Negeri Sembilan (-RM1.6 billion), Melaka (-RM1.3 billion), Kedah (-RM870.8 million), Pahang (-RM712.9 million), Terengganu (-RM251.8 million), Sarawak (-RM211.0 million), Sabah (-RM96.4 million) and W.P. Labuan (-RM48.6 million).

Selangor dominates Malaysia's imports with a share of 29.2 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (23.0%), Johor (20.5%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (9.2%) and Kedah (4.4%).

ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

Malaysia, for the first time, ranked as number one (1) globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 198 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme 'Statistics is the Essence of Life'. Meanwhile, the Fourth World Statistics Day will be celebrated on 20th October 2025, with the theme 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

May 2024 – May 2025 (RM Billion)**


