KEMENTERIAN EKONOMI
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PENUNJUK EKONOMI MALAYSIA INDEKS PELOPOR, SERENTAK & SUSULAN OGOS 2025

Ekonomi Malaysia dijangka berkembang pada kadar sederhana menjelang tahun 2026, dengan Indeks Pelopor mencatatkan 113.7 mata pada Ogos 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 24 Oktober 2025 – Prospek ekonomi Malaysia terus menunjukkan tanda-tanda penyederhanaan dengan Indeks Pelopor (IP) mencatatkan penurunan 0.5 peratus kepada 113.7 mata pada Ogos 2025 berbanding 114.3 mata pada bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya (**Paparan I**), seperti yang dilaporkan oleh Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM). Perincian prestasi ini diterbitkan dalam penerbitan **Penunjuk Ekonomi Malaysia: Indeks Pelopor, Serentak & Susulan bagi Ogos 2025** yang dikeluarkan pada hari ini. IP memberi petunjuk awal tentang titik perubahan dalam kitaran perniagaan dan arah tuju ekonomi dalam tempoh terdekat.

Mengulas lanjut mengenai prestasi terbaharu IP, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, "Prestasi ini sebahagian besarnya dipengaruhi oleh penurunan ketara dalam Import Benar Logam Asas Berharga & Logam Bukan Ferus Lain (-26.9%), sejajar dengan kelembapan permintaan global. Pada asas bulanan, IP mencatatkan penurunan 0.8 peratus, dipengaruhi oleh penurunan dalam Import Benar Semi Konduktor (-0.7%), selaras dengan sentimen perdagangan global yang berhati-hati."

Trend arah aliran jangka panjang terlicin IP pada Ogos 2025 kekal berada di bawah 100.0 mata (**Paparan II**). Ini menggambarkan bahawa ekonomi Malaysia kekal menyederhana, dipengaruhi oleh landskap domestik yang stabil sebagai penggerak

pertumbuhan dan kepelbagaian industri yang membolehkan kestabilan ekonomi walaupun berdepan cabaran global.

Sementara itu, Indeks Serentak (IS) yang menggambarkan prestasi ekonomi semasa, mengekalkan momentum positifnya dengan peningkatan tahunan sebanyak 2.1 peratus kepada 128.9 mata pada Ogos 2025 berbanding 126.3 mata pada bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Pertumbuhan ini disokong terutamanya oleh peningkatan dalam Nilai Caruman Benar, Kumpulan Wang Simpanan Pekerja (KWSP) sebanyak 9.6 peratus, selaras dengan trend peningkatan pasaran buruh susulan aktiviti ekonomi domestik yang kukuh. Walau bagaimanapun, prestasi bulanan IS menunjukkan sedikit penyederhanaan dengan penurunan sebanyak 0.6 peratus, berikutan kelembapan dalam beberapa komponen, khususnya Penggunaan Kapasiti dalam Pembuatan (-0.3%).

Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025: Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) akan mempengerusikan Jawatankuasa Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) yang bertujuan untuk memperkukuh kerjasama statistik ke arah pembangunan serantau yang mampan.

Malaysia buat julung kalinya telah menduduki tangga pertama (1) di peringkat global dalam laporan dwi-tahunan Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 yang dikeluarkan oleh Open Data Watch (ODW), mengatasi 197 negara lain. Pencapaian ini merupakan lonjakan ketara daripada kedudukan ke-67 dalam penilaian ODIN 2022/23.

Kerajaan Malaysia telah mengisytiharkan 20 Oktober sebagai Hari Statistik Negara (MyStats Day), dengan tema 'Statistik Nadi Kehidupan.' Sementara itu, Hari Statistik Dunia Keempat akan disambut pada 20 Oktober 2025 dengan tema 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

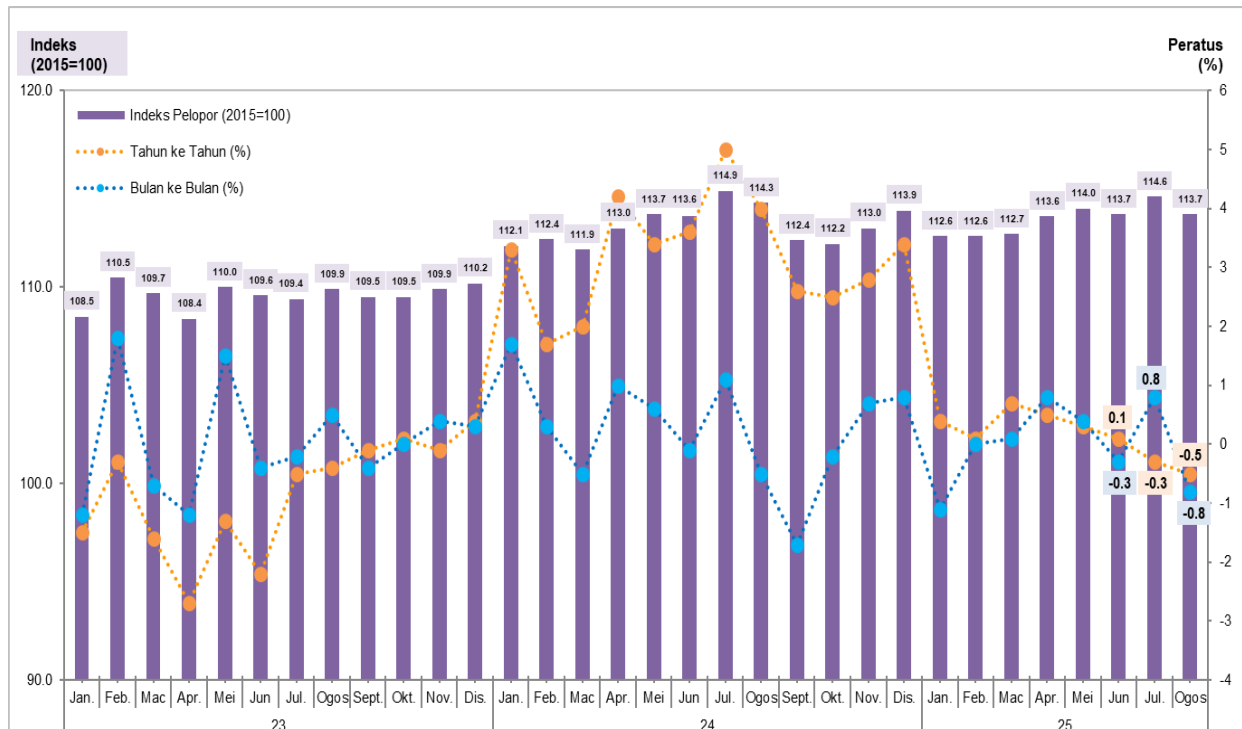

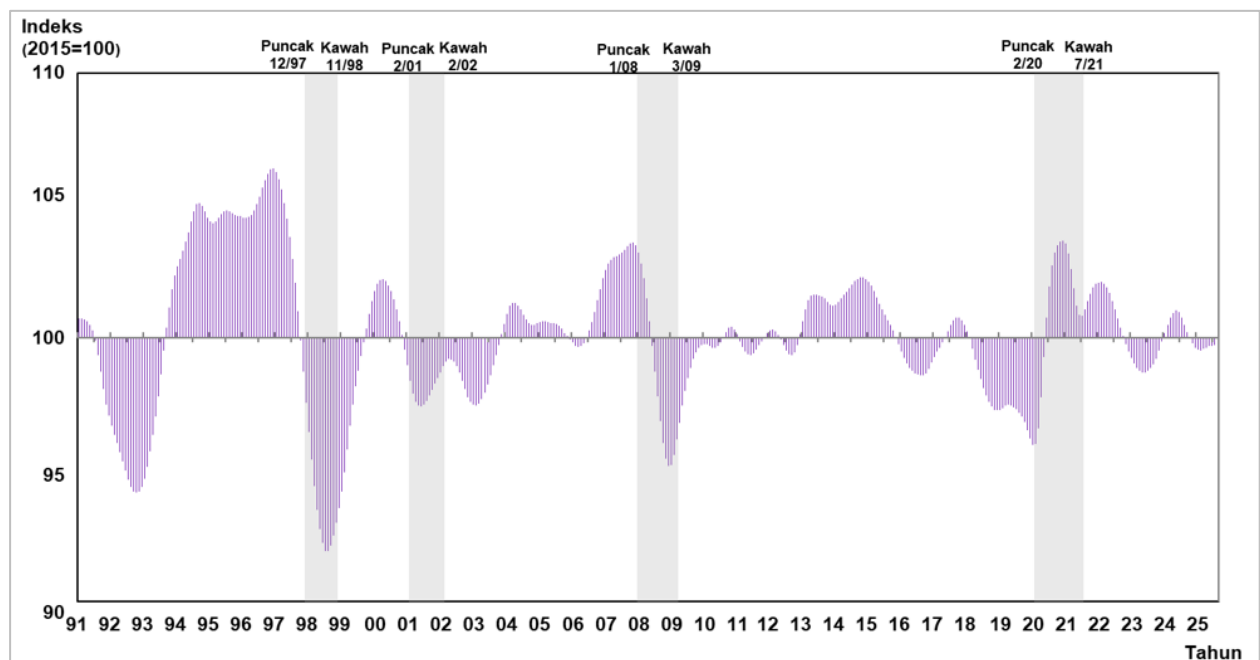

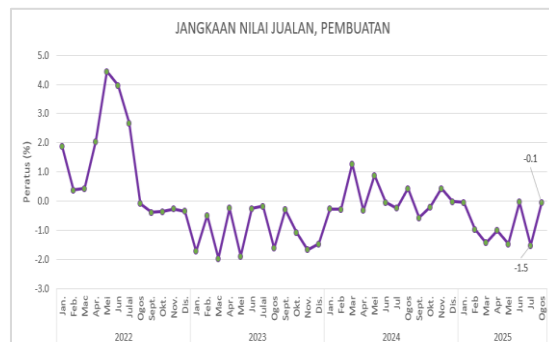
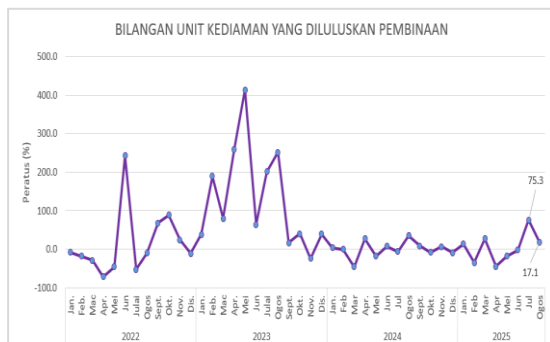
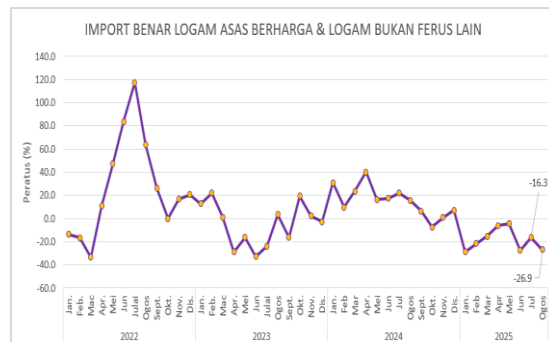
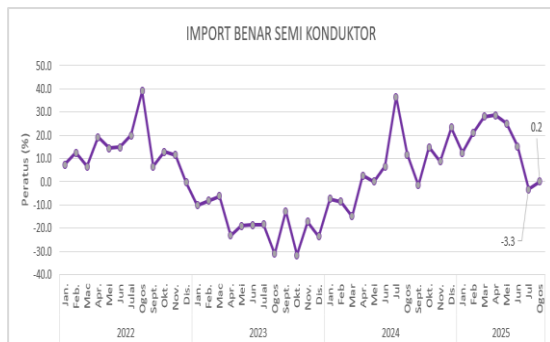
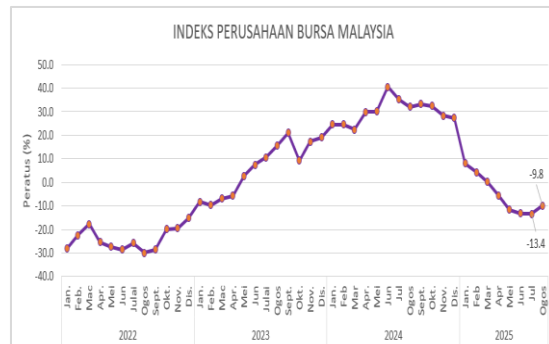
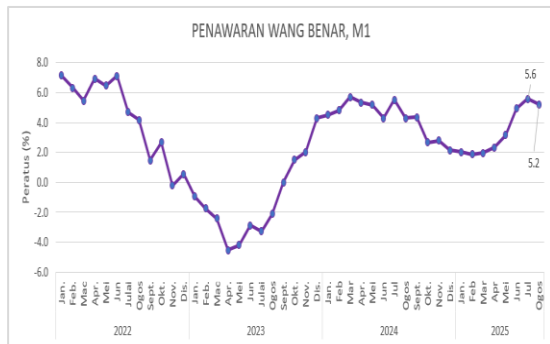
Paparan I: Indeks Komposit Pelopor

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MALAYSIAN ECONOMIC INDICATORS LEADING, COINCIDENT & LAGGING INDEXES AUGUST 2025

**Malaysia's economy is poised to expand at a modest pace into 2026,
with the Leading Index registering 113.7 points in August 2025**

PUTRAJAYA, October 24, 2025 – Malaysia's economic outlook continued to show signs of moderation with the Leading Index (LI) recording a decline of 0.5 per cent to 113.7 points in August 2025 as compared to 114.3 points in the same month of the previous year (**Exhibit I**), as reported by the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM). The detailed performance is published in the publication **Malaysian Economic Indicators: Leading, Coincident & Lagging Indexes for August 2025** released today. The LI provides an early indication of turning points in the business cycle and the near-term direction of the economy.

Commenting further on the latest performance of the LI, Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "This performance was largely influenced by a significant decrease in Real Imports of Other Basic Precious & Other Non-ferrous Metals (-26.9%), in line with the slowdown of the global demand. On a monthly basis, the LI registered a decline of 0.8 per cent, weighed down by a reduction in Real Imports of Semi Conductors (-0.7%), consistent with cautious global trade sentiment."

The LI smoothed long-term trend in August 2025 remained below 100.0 points (**Exhibit II**). This reflect that the Malaysia's economy remains modest, influenced by

steady domestic landscape as the driver of growth and diversified industries which allow economic stability despite global challenges.

Meanwhile, the Coincident Index (CI) which reflects the current state of the economy, maintained its positive momentum with an annual increase of 2.1 per cent to 128.9 points in August 2025, compared to 126.3 points in the same month last year. This growth was mainly supported by a rise in Real Contributions, Employees Provident Fund (EPF) by 9.6 per cent, consistent with the uptick trend in the labour market following robust domestic economic activity. However, the monthly performance of the CI showed a slight slowdown with a dip of 0.6 per cent, following moderation in several components, particularly Capacity Utilisation in Manufacturing (-0.3%).

ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

Malaysia, for the first time, ranked as number one (1) globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme 'Statistics is the Essence of Life'. Meanwhile, the Fourth World Statistics Day will be celebrated on 20th October 2025, with the theme 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

Exhibit I: Leading Composite Index

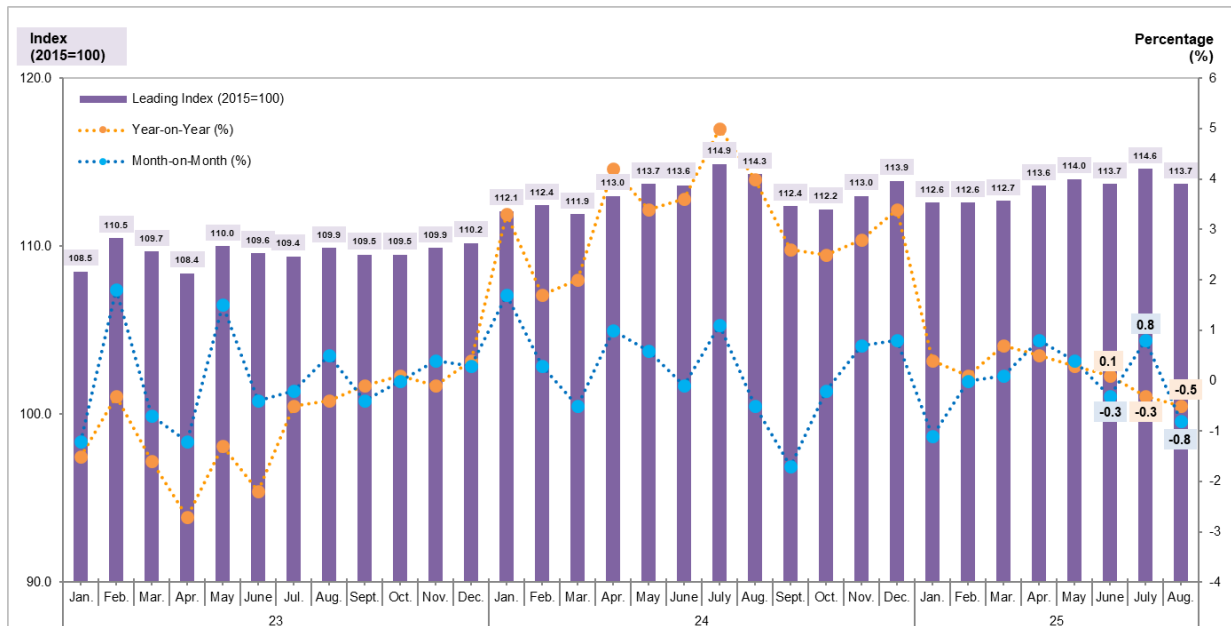


Exhibit II: Leading Composite Index (Long Term Trend = 100) and Business Cycle

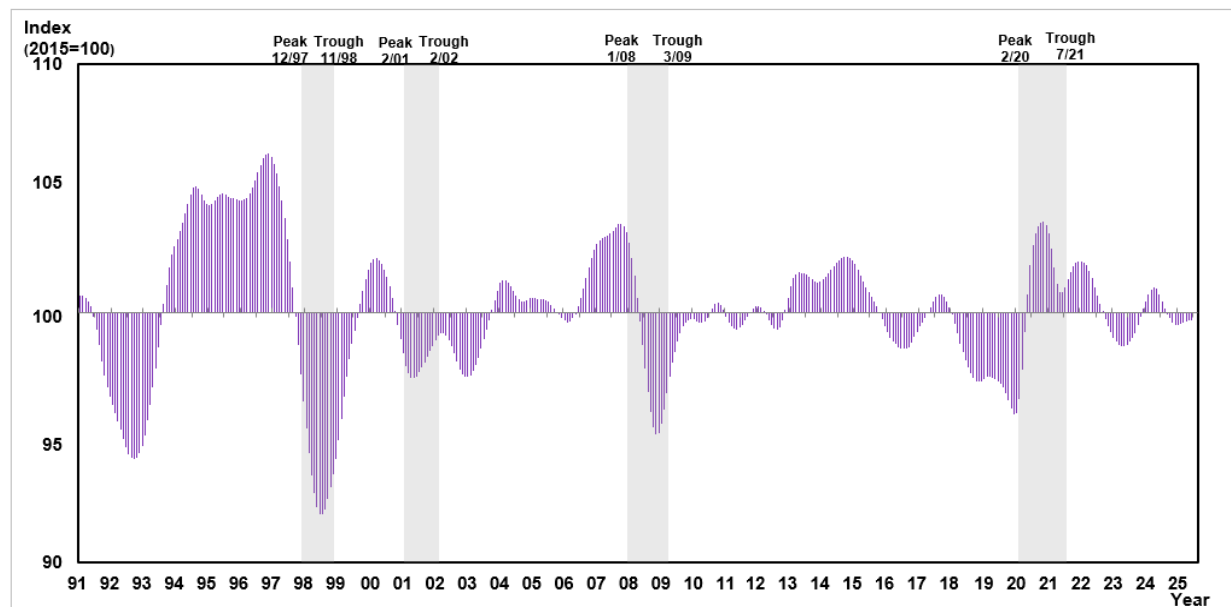


Exhibit III: Annual Changes of Leading Index Components
