**JUMLAH PERDAGANGAN BAGI LAPAN NEGERI MEREKODKAN
PENINGKATAN BERNILAI RM262.1 BILION PADA BULAN
DISEMBER 2025**

PUTRAJAYA, 28 JANUARI 2026 – Malaysia mencatatkan jumlah perdagangan bernilai RM286.6 bilion pada Disember 2025 dengan eksport dan import masing-masing bernilai RM153.0 bilion dan RM133.7 bilion, seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI DISEMBER 2025**.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menyatakan bahawa eksport Malaysia pada Disember 2025 mencapai RM153.0 bilion, mencatatkan peningkatan tahun ke tahun sebanyak RM14.3 bilion (+10.4%). Peningkatan eksport dipengaruhi oleh eksport yang lebih tinggi di Johor (+RM9.4 bilion), Pulau Pinang (+RM8.6 bilion), Perak (+RM546.5 juta) dan Selangor (+RM90.8 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, nilai eksport menurun di Sarawak sebanyak RM1.1 bilion, Sabah (-RM921.8 juta), Terengganu (-RM757.2 juta), Melaka (-RM378.0 juta), Pahang (-RM185.9 juta), Kedah (-RM104.9 juta), Kelantan (-RM103.0 juta), W.P. Labuan (-RM89.9 juta), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (-RM68.6 juta), Negeri Sembilan (-RM41.6 juta) dan Perlis (-RM11.8 juta).

Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama dengan sumbangan 40.1 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (22.5%), Selangor (14.7%), Sarawak (6.0%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (3.3%).

Mengulas lanjut mengenai prestasi import, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata import pada bulan Disember 2025 meningkat RM14.3 bilion (+12.0%) berbanding bulan yang sama pada tahun 2024. Peningkatan import disebabkan oleh import yang lebih tinggi di kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM5.8 bilion), Johor (+RM3.6 bilion), Kedah (+RM2.3 bilion), Selangor (+RM2.3 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 bilion), Perak (+RM753.5 juta), Negeri Sembilan (+RM265.6 juta), Pahang (+RM207.0 juta),

Terengganu (+RM58.1 juta) dan Sabah (+RM50.6 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, nilai import menurun di Melaka sebanyak RM1.3 bilion, Sarawak (-RM359.5 juta), W.P. Labuan (-RM282.0 juta), Perlis (-RM35.7 juta) dan Kelantan (-RM21.8 juta).


Selangor mendominasi import Malaysia dengan sumbangan 27.0 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (24.8%), Johor (21.1%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.7%) dan Kedah (7.0%).

Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) sedang melaksanakan Banci Ekonomi 2026 (BE2026), bertemakan “Data Nadi Ekonomi Rakyat”. Pelaksanaan Banci Ekonomi kali keenam ini berlangsung dari 5 Januari hingga 31 Oktober 2026. BE2026 bertujuan untuk mengumpul data yang menyeluruh dan berstruktur daripada semua pertubuhan perniagaan berdaftar dan tidak berdaftar di Malaysia, bagi menilai prestasi, struktur serta ciri-ciri ekonomi negara secara komprehensif dan berasaskan bukti.

Malaysia buat julung kalinya telah menduduki tangga pertama (1) di peringkat global dalam laporan dwi-tahunan Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 yang dikeluarkan oleh Open Data Watch (ODW), mengatasi 197 negara lain. Pencapaian ini merupakan lonjakan ketara daripada kedudukan ke-67 dalam penilaian ODIN 2022/23.



FOR EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE DECEMBER 2025

TOTAL TRADE FOR EIGHT STATES RECORDED A POSITIVE GROWTH WITH A VALUE OF RM262.1 BILLION IN DECEMBER 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 28 JANUARY 2026 – Malaysia's total trade for December 2025 amounted to RM286.6 billion with exports and imports recording RM153.0 billion and RM133.7 billion, respectively as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE DECEMBER 2025**.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin unveiled that Malaysia's exports in December 2025 reached RM153.0 billion, marking a year-on-year increase of RM14.3 billion (+10.4%). The increase in exports was attributed to the higher exports in Johor (+RM9.4 billion), Pulau Pinang (+RM8.6 billion), Perak (+RM546.5 million) and Selangor (+RM90.8 million). However, exports decreased in Sarawak by RM1.1 billion, Sabah (-RM921.8 million), Terengganu (-RM757.2 million), Melaka (-RM378.0 million), Pahang (-RM185.9 million), Kedah (-RM104.9 million), Kelantan (-RM103.0 million), W.P. Labuan (-RM89.9 million), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (-RM68.6 million), Negeri Sembilan (-RM41.6 million) and Perlis (-RM11.8 million).

Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a contribution of 40.1 per cent, followed by Johor (22.5%), Selangor (14.7%), Sarawak (6.0%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (3.3%).

Elaborating on imports performance, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin stated that imports in December 2025 increased RM14.3 billion (+12.0%) as compared to the same month in year 2024. The increase in imports was attributed by the higher imports in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM5.8 billion), Johor (+RM3.6 billion), Kedah (+RM2.3 billion), Selangor (+RM2.3 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 billion), Perak (+RM753.5 million), Negeri Sembilan (+RM265.6 million), Pahang (+RM207.0 million), Terengganu (+RM58.1 million) and Sabah (+RM50.6 million). However, imports decreased in Melaka by RM1.3 billion, Sarawak (-RM359.5 million),

W.P. Labuan (-RM282.0 million), Perlis (-RM35.7 million) and Kelantan (-RM21.8 million).


Selangor dominates Malaysia’s imports with a share of 27.0 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (24.8%), Johor (21.1%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.7%) and Kedah (7.0%).

The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) is conducting the Economic Census 2026 (BE2026), themed “Data Nadi Ekonomi Rakyat”. The sixth Economic Census, running from 5th January to 31st October 2026. BE2026 aims to collect comprehensive, structured data from all registered and unregistered business establishments in Malaysia to assess the nation’s economic performance, structure and characteristics in an evidence-based manner.

Malaysia has, for the first time, successfully secured the top position globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.


Chart 1: Exports and Imports in Johor, Pulau Pinang and Selangor, December 2024 – December 2025 (RM Billion)
